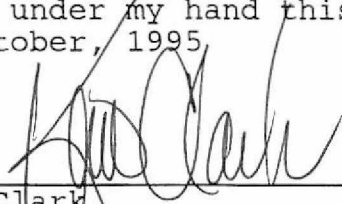


RESOLUTION 95-09
