**CONCERNING THE PROPOSED ABANDONMENT AND REPURPOSING OF THE
TENNESSEE GAS PIPELINE #100-1 PIPELINE
BY KINDER MORGAN ENERGY PARTNERS**

WHEREAS, the health and safety of the citizens of Madison County are of the utmost importance to its governing body, and

WHEREAS, our land, water, and air are crucial parts of the health and safety, and

WHEREAS, Kinder Morgan Energy Partners is proposing to "abandon" Tennessee Gas pipeline #100-1, repurposing it for the transmission of natural gas liquids (NGLs) as part of the Utica Marcellus Texas Pipeline Project, and

WHEREAS, this repurposing is projected to include reversing the flow of the pipeline from its present southwest to northeast direction to northeast to southwest, changing the dynamic loading within the pipeline, and

WHEREAS, repurposing of a natural gas pipeline this large to carry natural gas liquids (NGLs) has never been attempted and it has not been determined whether the existing pipeline is capable of transporting such natural gas liquids (NGLs), and

WHEREAS, the federal Pipeline Hazardous Materials Safety Administration's Office of Pipeline Safety has altered "operations of hazardous liquid and gas transmission pipelines of the potential significant impact flow reversals, product changes and conversion to service may have on the integrity of the pipeline. Failures on natural gas transmission and hazardous liquid pipelines have occurred after these operational changes", and

WHEREAS, natural gas liquids are 150 times more explosive than natural gas (methane) alone, and

WHEREAS, 24.5 miles of this 72-year old pipeline runs through Madison County, and

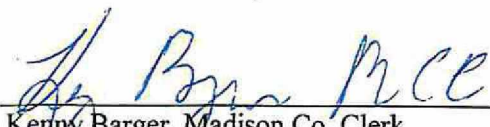
WHEREAS, regardless of the use or potential use of the compression station in Madison County, The Madison County Fiscal Court is concerned about the noise level associated with this operation:

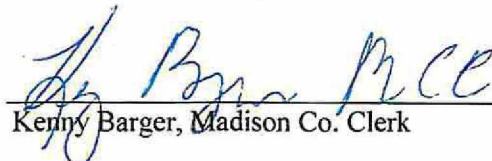
