RESOLUTION15-08

WHEREAS, the health and safety of the citizens of Madison County are of the utmost importance to its governing body, and

WHEREAS, our land, soil, water, and air are crucial parts of the health and safety, and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Gas Pipeline Company (TGP), a subsidiary of Kinder Morgan, Inc., is proposing the Broad Run Expansion project to expand transportation capacity of natural gas on its existing TGP system, and

WHEREAS, this project includes the construction of a new bi-directional compressor station in Madison County, Kentucky, to be known as the Richmond Compressor Station 875 ("CS 875"), and

WHEREAS, the new compressor stations consists of one 16,000 horsepower (hp) ISO rated Solar Mars 100 model C65 turbine/compressor unit and necessary auxiliary equipment, and

WHEREAS, in a separate certificate application for the ACRP, Tennessee proposes to add a new Taurus 70 compressor unit at the CS 875 facility, which will add 10,771 horsepower (hp), and

WHEREAS, the Broad Run Expansion Project and the ACRP/UMTP Project may both be conducting construction activities at the CS 875 site within approximately the same time frame, and

WHEREAS, temporary construction will impact 48.6 acres of grassland/agricultural vegetation and permanent operation will impact 25 acres of grassland/agricultural vegetation, by permanent aboveground facilities or other developed surfaces (e.g., gravel, asphalt), and

WHEREAS, higher air emissions and pollutants will be generated due to CS 875, including, emissions of CO = carbon monoxide, CO₂e = carbon dioxide equivalents, HAPs = hazardous air pollutants, NO_x = nitrogen oxides. PM_{2.5} = particulate matter, with an aerodynamic diameter of 2.5 microns or less. SO₂ = sulfur dioxide and VOC = volatile organic compounds, none of which are currently present, which can be highly variable in intensity, frequency or durations, and

WHEREAS, additional continuous day/night noise will be generated by CS 875 during construction, and

WHEREAS, additional continuous day/night noise will be generated by CS 875 during normal operations, generated by the following components of the site: Compressor/Valve Building, the Equipment Door, Building Ventilation, Comp. Suction and Discharge Piping, Turbine Exhaust, Turbine Inlet, and

WHEREAS, day/night noise levels will be increased during "blowdowns" which occur when the high pressure gas in the system is released, and

WHEREAS, potential ground-borne vibrations from CS 875, and

WHEREAS, wildlife habitat will be affected, and

WHEREAS, natural gas compressor stations are explosive and the station will only be remotely monitored from Tennessee's gas control center located in Houston, Texas, and

WHEREAS, the new CS 875 significantly affects the quality of the human psychological and physical health and environment, and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) addressing the request of Tennessee Gas Pipeline Company, LLC to build a new compressor station #875 in Madison County, Kentucky, as part of Docket CP15-77 has not been developed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, we, the Madison County Fiscal Court, oppose the construction of the new bi-directional compressor station in Madison County, Kentucky, to be known as the Richmond Compressor Station 875 ("CS 875"), on 89.8 acres of land, that will negatively affect our land, water, and air, putting the health and safety of our citizens and our environment at risk. The Madison County Fiscal Court hereby adopts this Resolution and authorizes the Madison County Judge Executive to sign and forward this Resolution to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) and urges the FERC to deny the construction of the Richmond Compressor Station 875.

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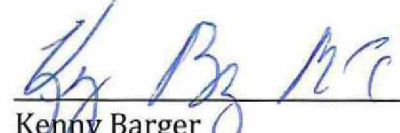
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
