RESOLUTION 19-35**

A RESOLUTION FOR MADISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, APPROVING PROCEDURES FOR COMPLIANCE WITH 504 REGULATIONS ON HANDICAPPED ACCESSIBILITY

WHEREAS, the Madison County Fiscal Court has been awarded a Community Development Block Grant Program by the Commonwealth of Kentucky, for workforce activities; and,

WHEREAS, as the recipient of Community Development Block Grant funds, the County is required to comply with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (24 CFR Part 8),

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MADISON COUNTY FISCAL COURT TO UNDERTAKE THE FOLLOWING:

1. Public Notice: Madison County is establishing a policy of non-discrimination on the basis of disability status. The County will publish a notice in the local newspaper designating a person as the 504 Coordinator.
2. 504 Committee: The County will appoint a committee to participate in conducting a Self-Evaluation and in creating a Transition Plan as applicable; the committee will include a handicapped person or a person to represent the handicapped.
3. Self-Evaluation: The 504 Committee will conduct a Self-Evaluation or a Needs Assessment relative to handicapped accessibility of all public buildings within Madison County (public use buildings currently owned and/or maintained by the County). Practices and policies of the governing body must be evaluated with coordination to their intended effect and actual effect on handicapped individuals. The Self-Evaluation will include a physical description of the County's facilities regarding handicapped accessibility with a description of existing sidewalks and handicapped parking spaces, where applicable.
4. Transition Plan: If the County's programs and activities cannot be made accessible by making administrative changes, structural changes will be outlined in a Transition Plan. The plan will identify steps required to complete the structural modifications.
5. Grievance Procedure: A grievance procedure will be adopted and implemented. The procedure will provide for timely resolution of discrimination complaints against the County pertaining to accessibility of the County's policies and practices. Appropriate due process standards, such as an appeals process and specific methods for filing complaints, will be incorporated into the procedure. The length of time allotted for the recipient to review and respond to the complaint will be made clear in the grievance procedure.
