WHEREAS, today's automobile industry is uncertain and unpredictable due to Covid-19; and

WHEREAS, the purchase of these vehicles will allow the Sheriff's Department to maintain their fleet;

I Sheriff Mike Coyle, respectfully request the Madison County Fiscal Court to grant permission to purchase four, 2021, Chevrolet Tahoe's (Police Package units). The vehicles are quoted at the state contract pricing which we received in January, 2021. The money needed for this purchase will be included in and for the 2022 Madison County Sheriffs Budget.

The purpose of this request is due to the unusual and uncertain circumstances caused by the Covid – 19 pandemics across our nation and world that has affected us all. The Automobile Industry is so uncertain and unpredictable that MCSO has just been notified that we have just received delivery for two Chevrolet Tahoe's that were ordered in January for the 2021, budget.

When Backman Chevrolet Auto Group in Louisville Ky., notified us in late September of the delivery, the sales representative and contact person Chuck Hill, stated that they had 34 more units that had just arrived with our order and were in stock if we were interested.

A few days later in a phone conversation with Chuck Hill, planning to pick our ordered Tahoe's up and transporting them to L&W Emergency Equipment, in Lawrenceburg, Ky to have them outfitted and equipment installed, Chuck Hill advised that the 34 Tahoe's he had earlier advised me about had all been sold.

Chuck Hill advised they were waiting now for the last shipment order of 2021's Police Package Tahoe's to be shipped and to arrive at their dealership anytime. This would be the last of the 2021's they would receive.

Chuck Hill stated that if we wanted any of these 2021's he would tag them for the MCSO to purchase under the 2021 state contract price still in effect. He stated the 2022's would have an increase in cost price predicted increase up to \$2500.00-\$3500.00, for each unit. Chevrolet had not scheduled a date for 2022 production and a delivery date was unknown and uncertain due to the economical state of the nation, parts suppliers, work force and chips for these vehicles. Chuck Hill stated it would probably be like 2021 or even worse for the automotive industry.

Backman Auto Group, state contract quote for 2021 Police Package Tahoe's - \$39,421.70
L&W Emergency Equipment quote – outfitting equipment and installation - \$14,492.49

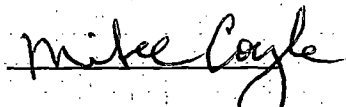
The total for each unit \$53,914.19
 $4 \times \$53,914.19 = \$215,656.76$

I am requesting an additional \$26,000.00 for the 2022 budget to purchase a vehicle to be utilized as a Narcotic vehicle to replace a 2013 Chevrolet Impala with over 212,000 thousand miles that needs new tires as well as having mechanical issues.

Frankfort Toyota has given a state contract price quote of \$26000.00 for a 2022 Toyota Camry to be use as a Narcotic vehicle.

I request \$241,656.76 for the purchase approval for theses vehicles to be approved to maintain our MCSO fleet and to be funded from the 2022 Sheriffs budget.
