ASAP Harm Reduction Grant Proposal FY2022

The opiate epidemic is hitting Madison County hard. Public health data illustrate the impact of the substance use epidemic. According to Kentucky Injury Prevention and Research Center, in 2020 Madison County had an overdose fatality rate of 72/100,000, compared to the state rate of 44/100,000. Madison County's number of fatal overdoses continues to increase every year. Nationally, fentanyl is now the leading cause of death of in Americans ages 18 – 45. Every aspect of the community is affected by this epidemic of overdose, and the ASAP Board wants to be a part of the solution. The ASAP Board has decided to allocate all of the Harm Reduction grant resources toward addressing the opiate overdose crisis in Madison County through Narcan and overdose education. We believe that every single life is worth saving and recovery is possible.

\$10,000: Purchasing Narcan for EMS

\$10,000: Funding SPARK Ministries' outreach effort to continue providing Narcan from 10 – 5 every Monday – Thursday in downtown Richmond, as well as evening and weekend neighborhood outreach.

Total: \$20,000
