**A RESOLUTION OF THE MADISON COUNTY FISCAL COURT
REGARDING THE TRANSITION OF CSEPP PREPAREDNESS FUNDING
TO COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY OPERATIONS**

WHEREAS, Madison County has, for more than three decades, been participating in and the leading jurisdiction in the Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP), a federal and state program that provided essential resources to strengthen preparedness, public safety, emergency communications, and community resilience; and

WHEREAS, the mission of CSEPP has now been successfully completed with the elimination of the chemical stockpile, and with its completion, **CSEPP funding allocations will conclude on September 30, 2025**; and

WHEREAS, beginning **October 1, 2025**, the expenses previously funded through CSEPP—such as preparedness activities, emergency communications operations, and related public safety initiatives—will be transitioned into other county departmental budgets including, but not limited to, the Emergency Communications Center (911), Emergency Management Agency, and other public safety divisions; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the funding transition, designated staff positions and operational responsibilities previously assigned under CSEPP will also be transitioned as of October 1, 2025; and

WHEREAS, this transition has been carefully planned and anticipated for many years, allowing Madison County to ensure the continuation of high-quality public safety services without disruption; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court recognizes that the investments made through CSEPP have significantly improved the county's readiness, public safety operations and provided a strong foundation for a safer and more resilient future for Madison County citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MADISON COUNTY FISCAL COURT:

1. That the Fiscal Court formally acknowledges the conclusion of CSEPP preparedness funding as of **September 30, 2025**.
2. That effective **October 1, 2025**, associated expenses, designated staff, and operational responsibilities shall be transitioned into the closeout budgets, regular budgets and organizational structures of the Madison County Emergency Communications Center (911), Emergency Management Agency, and other designated public safety agencies as applicable

3. That the Fiscal Court reaffirms its commitment to maintaining and building upon the legacy of preparedness established under CSEPP, ensuring that the people of Madison County remain well-protected and well-served in all future public safety endeavors.
